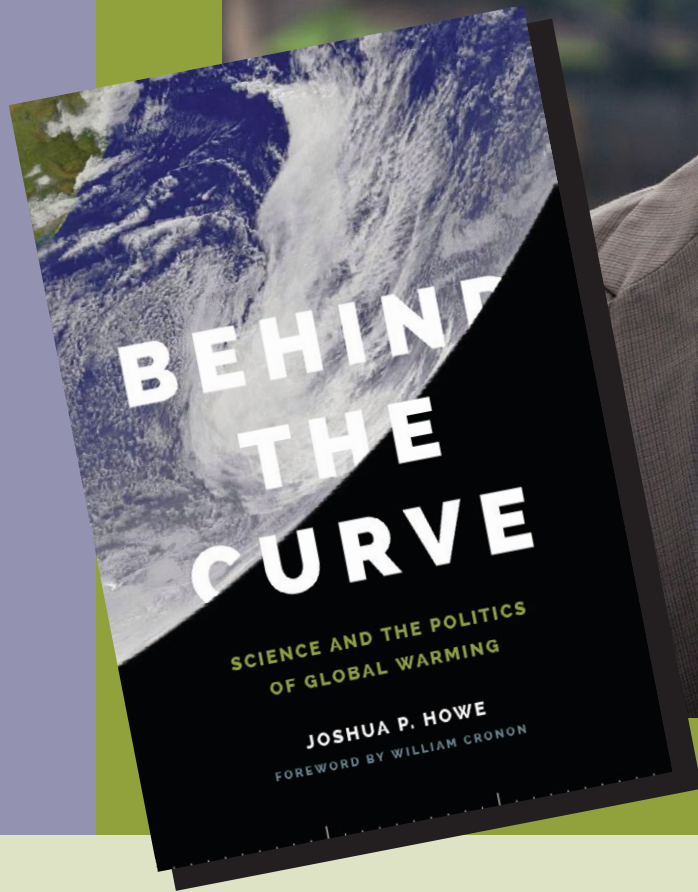

Joshua Howe is Assistant Professor of History and Environmental Studies at Reed College. His new book, *Behind the Curve: Science and the Politics of Global Warming* (Seattle: University of Washington Press, 2014), explores the political history of climate change since the 1950s, and he continues to work on historical questions about sustainability and the global environment that bridge environmental history, the history of science, and the history of American foreign policy. Josh earned his Ph.D. in History from Stanford in 2010, and subsequently worked as a postdoctoral fellow with the National Science Foundation's John Tyndall Correspondence Project at Montana State University in Bozeman Montana until he moved to Portland to take up his position at Reed in the fall of 2012. Josh writes for a variety of outlets, including *Mountain Outlaw Magazine*, *the Big Sky Weekly*, a popular cycling website called *Velominati*, and has appeared in *Climatic Change and Historical Studies of the Natural Sciences*.
