Program Options

Please read the following information carefully before completing your application. At this time, all clinical rotations for both options take place in Washington State.

The LPN2RN eLearning option is a hybrid program option. One cohort that begins each year in the fall and completes during the following summer (four academic quarters, including summer). It is important to note that each quarter counts as $\frac{3}{4}$ of full-time enrollment (10 credits), and each course is offered only once per year.

Fall, winter, and spring coursework is completed online (except for an in-person skills lab held over 2 weeks in mid-June).

Summer clinical rotations take place at multiple sites in western Washington, with which LCC has clinical affiliations (currently Longview, Vancouver, Centralia, Olympia, and Renton).

Student clinical site preferences are considered but are not guaranteed.

Students are responsible for making lodging arrangements for summer clinical rotations.

Students choosing the LPN2RN campus opt-in will join the second year of a campus cohort in progress (advanced placement). This option has fall, winter, and spring start options, with no summer classes.

Classes are a mixture of modalities, including in-person, hybrid, and asynchronous online.

Typically, at least two days of in-person attendance will be required per week. The days will vary from quarter to quarter depending on the clinical site and faculty availability.

Clinical rotations are completed with theory/didactic courses and are only offered locally (Longview and surrounding areas).

Preceptorships may be located in Longview, Vancouver, Centralia, or Olympia. Student clinical site preferences are considered but are not guaranteed.

Selective Admission

In the event that there are more qualified applicants than seats available in the nursing program for this admission cycle, points will be awarded (up to a maximum of 26 points) in the following manner:

1. Grade Point Average (GPA) points are awarded as follows:

A maximum of 8 points will be awarded for the calculated, verifiable cumulative GPA for prerequisite support courses. Only the 45 required prerequisite credits for the AN-DTA/MRP may be counted toward the cumulative GPA for selective admission to the program (BIOL series, CHEM& 121, ENGL& 101, MATH& 146, and PSYC& 100 and 200). The selective admission GPA points do not include the corequisite courses that may be taken after beginning the program (NUTR& 101, Humanities distribution, and CMST& 220 or ENGL& 102).

The cumulative prerequisite GPA is calculated by the applicant in the application and verified by the Healthcare Programs Coordinator. Points may not be counted for courses that are incomplete at the time the application closes (e.g., fall classes may not be used for GPA points during the Cycle 2 application, due on October 31). $GPA \times 2 = GPA \text{ points}$.

For instance, an applicant with a 3.6 cumulative prerequisite GPA will be awarded 7.2 points.

2. Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) points are awarded as follows:

A maximum of 6 points will be awarded for the highest composite (total) TEAS score within the permissible testing window (i.e., within two years of the application cycle closing date).

For a TEAS composite (total) score of

- 85% or higher - 6 points
- 80 - 84.9% - 5 points
- 75 - 79.9% - 4 points
- 70 - 74.9% - 3 points
- 65 - 69.9% - 2 points
- Below 65% - 0 points
