### ***Points for Selective Admission - Grade Point Average (GPA) Points***

A **maximum of 8 points** will be awarded for the calculated, verifiable cumulative GPA for prerequisite support courses. Only the **45 required prerequisite credits** for the AN-DTA/MRP may be counted toward the cumulative GPA for selective admission to the program (BIOL series, CHEM& 121, ENGL& 101, MATH& 146, and PSYC& 100 and 200). The selective admission GPA points **do not include** the corequisite courses that may be taken after beginning the program (NUTR& 101, Humanities distribution, and CMST& 220 or ENGL& 102).

The cumulative prerequisite GPA is calculated by the applicant in the application and verified by the Healthcare Programs Coordinator. Points may not be counted for courses that are incomplete at the time the application closes (e.g., fall classes may not be used for GPA points during the Cycle 2 application, due on October 31). **GPA x 2 = GPA points.**

For instance, an applicant with a 3.6 cumulative prerequisite GPA will be awarded 7.2 points.
