

Art Selection Committee Bylaws

I. Mission and Purpose

The Art Selection Committee will be responsible for acceptance and location of donated art objects, markers and monuments (other than instruction/gallery items) and purchase and location of art objects including the Art in Public Places Program.

The Art Selection Committee is responsible for selecting art through the Washington State Arts Commission Art in Public Places Program. This program facilitates the acquisition, placement, and stewardship of artwork in state-funded building projects. One-half of one percent for art funds is generated by new construction projects in state agencies, community colleges, universities, and public schools. Local committees representing project sites make all final artwork selection decisions.

II. Governance

The Art Selection Committee reports to the Vice President of Administration.

III. Authority

The committee will monitor and make decisions regarding the purchase, maintenance and care of all College art objects.

IV. Membership and Leadership

The Art Selection Committee shall consist of:
Vice President of Administration, chair (standing member)
Director of Campus Services (standing member)
College Architect (standing member)
Art Gallery Director (standing member)
Art Faculty Member (for the length of the project)
ASLCC Representative (for the length of the project)

Depending on the identified scope of a project, a project manager, a Washington State Arts Commission representative, Department of Enterprise Services representative, a building/department representative, an instructional department representative, and/or a local artist may be appointed to serve on the committee for a specific length of time or until the project is completed.

V. Subcommittees

The Art Committee shall establish subcommittees as necessary.

VI. Meetings

The committee will meet as requested by the Vice President of Administration.

VII. Operating Procedures

The committee will operate by consensus. Each member shall have one vote. Voting may be conducted in-person at the meeting or electronically.
