Informational items:
INFO 1 – Washington Inter-College Reciprocity Policy
 The Washington State Community and Technical College Inter-College Reciprocity Policy, May 2011, states “if a student transfers an individual course that meets a Diversity requirement at the sending college for a specific transfer degree, that course is considered to have met that requirement at the receiving college, even if this course does not have an exact equivalent and even if the course credit is awarded through prior learning credit.” The LCC catalog will be updated to reflect this policy.

A. Revise Degree	Pre-Dental Hygiene AA Effective Winter 2018	98-103 cr total
Rationale: When the transfer colleges began offering a baccalaureate in dental hygiene, the math requirement changed from intermediate algebra to statistics. This change is reflected in the proposal. The additional requirements of PSYC& 100, SOC& 101 and PE are also proposed as these courses are listed as prerequisites in baccalaureate programs.

Rationale: Delete MATH 098/099 option to meet Quantitative Skills. All degrees from LCC need to have a college-level Quantitative Skills requirement. Quantitative Skills requirement to be: MATH& 107 OR higher
