D.	Revise Degree	Education Focus AA-DTA (was Early Childhood Education Focus AA-DTA) (title, courses)	90 cr total
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Resolution: Currently, there are 3 AA-DTAs related to education. The current plans do not meet transfer requirements to teacher preparation programs and the descriptions are misleading to students. To streamline advising and lesson student confusion, the 3 AA-DTA- Education have been reviewed and it was possible to create 1 AA-DTA Education that met the needs of the previous three DTAs. The AA-DTA Education-Secondary Focus and the AA-DTA Elementary Education Focus for WSU Vancouver will be retired.

E.	Revise Degree	Teacher Education BAS (course)	180 cr total (90 lower-division cr, 90 upper-division cr)
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Rationale: Students completing the ECE track will have the option of taking ECED 439 Issues and Trends or EDUC 439 Portfolio and Professional Assessment. This will enable them to come back at a later date and complete requirements for certification if they chose.
