Course subject matter includes human relations topics, such as human behavior, interaction, communication, conflict, collaboration, teamwork, or growth and development, as evidenced by the course description and official course outcomes. Human relations topics represent a significant amount of the course content and outcomes.

Background:

[Professional/technical degrees](#) (AAS) must include “related instruction” as per the SBCTC policy. Related instruction includes human relations. There is no definition at the state level of what qualifies a course to be on this list – it is locally derived. Therefore, the Curriculum Committee, being the body at LCC that is responsible for such approvals, needs to approve the criteria for placement on the LCC Human Relations list.

[Related Instruction](#), as defined by Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU), is a recognizable body of at least nine quarter credits, or identified equivalent in depth and quality of learning, in program-related areas of communication, computation, and human relations for applied or specialized associate degree or certificate programs of 45 quarter credits in length. Certificates of 45 credits or more are required to have related instruction embedded within the learning outcomes. Colleges are required to clearly identify how the related instruction requirements are being met.
